RE: RoHS 2011/65/EU

To Whom It May Concern:

In June, 2011, the European Union adopted the RoHS II Directive, repealing the original RoHS Directive 2002/95/EC which has regulated hazardous substances (Pb, Hg, Cd, Cr⁺⁶, PBB and PBDE), PBB and PBDE) in new electrical and electronic equipment since June 2006. RoHS II 2011/65/EU continues the restriction of these six substances and the subsequent Directive 2015/863/EU amends RoHS II Annex II to add DEHP, BBP, DBP and DIPB as restricted substances.

Banner Engineering products covered under the RoHS II Directive are fully compliant with the material restrictions, conformity assessment and CE-marking requirements of RoHS II, in advance of the 22 July 2017 date mandated for Category 9 (*Industrial Monitoring and Control Instruments*). However, Article 2(4) (c) and (e) exempts equipment specifically designed to be installed, and fulfill its function, as part of another type of equipment or used on a large-scale fixed installation to be assembled, installed and de-installed by professionals. Banner Engineering continuously reviews new products to ensure compliance with the regulations described by RoHS II 2011/65/EU Directive as amended.
